High Water

- -Water at an all time high. Have no out/inlets. Rely on absorption and evaporation.
- -Ryan reported levels: Up from 2018 May to 2019 7.5 inches higher; up 11 inches from 2018; down 17 now from the beginning of the summer.
 - -Russ Wallstead looking into out let for high levels on the west end.
 - -Established lake level from FSC (Ferris State College) report from 1983?
 - -Renton Cottage taken down from being flooded
 - -The golf course doesn't have equipment to pump water out of the lake
 - -EROSION is happening! Folks are putting up sea walls at great expense.

-Discussion concerning the new culvert installed at 150th contributing to water level in the future.

VI. NEW BUSINESS:

- -Special Assessment District
 - -Gave update in old business
- -Discussion about harvesting took place: Harvesting native plants is not in budget. Harvest pathways for each owner? Chris will check into this further.
 - -\$400 acre for native plants/\$450 for starry stonewort.
- -A question was posed about obtaining a permit for harvesting to maintain healthy aquatic plants from EGLE. Yes, a permit is needed.
 - -Ryan Miller: demonstrated use of double bladed rake. Cuts and pulls in weeds. It's called the T Weeder rake.

 - -The question of the efficacy/impact of minnow planting was raised
 - -Does not have a negative impact on current aquatic life.
 - -DNR regulates what goes into the lake and requires a permit.
 - -Do we get away from the minnows?
 - -Sean Kelly will check work with others about the best fish to plant
 - -Contact Sean to help and contribute to the fund.
 - -T-shirt: shape of lake with row boat, maybe?

 - -Who wants to Coordinate this?
 - -Do we want to schedule it for July 3, 2021?
 - -Fireworks/Picnic/Band
- -Virginia VanWie Golf Outing Unrelated to the fourth to commemorate
